Year 5 Applications for Selective High School

Kooringal High School is the partially-selective high school in Wagga Wagga. Now in its fifth year we have over 100 students drawn from various schools who are accessing specialist Gifted and Talented education in our setting.

That provision includes:

- differentiated curriculum in all core subjects in all years,
- the Selective Class travels as a distinct group,
- a specific welfare support program for all selective students, in addition to the work we normally do with mainstream students,
- leadership programs at both junior and senior levels of the school,
- a Research Studies course in Years 9 & 10
 which has Board of Studies approval, which
 allows selective students to learn research skills
 and to determine their own areas of research,
- formal links with academic partners on three campuses of CSU who mentor students in the Research Studies program,
- a program with Toastmasters to teach students presentation skills,
- six staff who have recently completed the UNSW Certificate of Gifted Education,
- an extensive program of professional learning for all staff on teaching gifted and talented students.
- acceleration in Mathematics (in some cases two years ahead of cohort), and
- an in-school Gifted and Talented Coordinator whose role is to manage the liaison with parents.

So it's a package which is providing education for between 24 and 28 students each year.

Anyone can sit the test which is the same test undertaken by all selective students across the state. Apply now in Year 5 to sit the test early next year in Year 6 for a place in Year 7 the following year.

The closing date is **November 18th with Year 5 being the market**. If you are interested please contact Mrs Jones.
